Dr. Alice Belcher's insight as an expert in the prevention of domestic violence and sexual assault otherwise referred to as family violence prevention is here with her release of The Alice Belcher Family Violence Library. The books in this library are meant to be shared with, educators, allies, and families in an expansive effort to demolish violence within families.

Dr. Belcher uses her knowledge as a researcher and survivor, to highlight the genre of family violence prevention using mixed method research. From the first book, Family Violence Prevention: For African American Communities, readers will gain insight and information on family violence prevention as an expanded strategy to ending family violence. This Library is a tool for self-study and coordinated classroom study, in the exploration of family violence prevention beyond intervention.

This first book, in this Library, is called PREVENTION. As with all of the books in this Library, the Alice Belcher Family Violence Library is written through the lens of what Dr. Belcher has coined, "The Black Female Activist Lens", as she acknowledges how acts of violence perpetrated by abusers, coupled with socioeconomic complexities, continue to plague and devastate black families. Dr. Belcher wants to arm families, allies and advocates with substantive tools to empower them to end family violence; thus, her contribution to the cause is with continued advocacy and the release of the Alice Belcher Family Library.
